10. Discussion of property tax liens. – City Attorney Bryan Guymon outlined reasons the City of Snyder cannot extinguish demolition liens. The City of Snyder has agreements with other taxing entities that contract with Perdue, Brandon, Fielder, Collins and Mott, LLP Attorneys to handle property taxes. If a property goes to public auction due to unpaid taxes, the proceeds first go to cover the unpaid taxes. Any remaining balance would then go toward subordinate liens such as a City's demolition lien and at that point the total lien is extinguished. In order for the City to forgive a demolition or weed lien on a property that is current on its property taxes, the owner and City can enter into a Chapter 380 agreement. Chapter 380 agreements specifically provide for offering loans and grants of City funds or services at little or no cost to promote state and local economic development and to stimulate business and commercial activity, and have to be for public purpose. Bryan Guymon stated single family residential property would likely not qualify for those agreements. State Law prohibits municipalities from giving away assets, which in the City's case would be extinguishing a lien.

WHEREAS, by comprehensive Zoning Ordinance No. 979, and subsequent amendments passed by the City of Snyder, the N 60' of the W 140' of Lot 2 Block 14, located at 2208 Avenue T was placed in an M-1 Light Manufacturing Zone; and

WHEREAS, the owner of the property did make application to the City Planning and Zoning Commission for a zone change to change the property from the M-1 Zone to an R-3 General Residential Zone; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed and considered Zone Case #363 and recommended the City of Snyder grant the request; and

ORDINANCE NO. 2031

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1099 TO ADD REGULATIONS REGARDING SOLICITATION IN THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY; PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Snyder, Texas has previously passed Ordinance No. 1099, providing for the regulation and licensing of peddlers, hawkers, solicitors, and itinerant merchants; establishing protections for homeowners desiring to avoid peddlers, solicitors and canvassers; and regulating handbills; and

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Snyder, Texas now wishes to amend such ordinance to add regulations pertaining to solicitation in the public right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Snyder finds that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of its citizens to amend this ordinance to add these provisions; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Snyder, Texas that the City of Snyder Ordinance No. 1099 is amended to read as follows:

SECTION I

Sections Seventeen and Eighteen shall be added to Ordinance No. 1099 and shall read as follows:

Section Seventeen. Solicitation in public right-of-way.

A. A person may solicit for a charitable or political purpose in or upon the public right-of-way, except those areas prohibited in this article.

B. A person may conduct commercial solicitation in or upon the public right-of way, except those areas prohibited in this article, if the solicitor has obtained a license or who is a member of an organization that has obtained a license.

C. Solicitation for any purpose in the public right-of-way shall be conducted only during the hours of daylight, specifically one (1) hour after sunrise and one (1) hour before sunset.

D. It shall be unlawful for a person younger than eighteen (18) years of age to solicit in the public right-of-way.

E. It shall be unlawful for a solicitor at any time to enter or remain in the traveled portion of the roadway unless the solicitor has been granted authorization pursuant to §552.0071 of Chapter 552 of the Texas Transportation Code. The restriction on solicitation in the traveled portion of the roadway does not apply to public residential streets.

F. It shall be unlawful for a solicitor at any time to enter or remain in the traveled portion of the roadway of residential streets so that their presence impedes the flow of traffic.

G. It shall be unlawful for a person to solicit in the public right-of-way that is within one thousand (1,000) feet of any public or private elementary or secondary school between the hours of 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. on days when such school is in session. The measurement of the distance shall be made from the nearest property line of the public or private elementary or secondary school.

Section Eighteen. Solicitation in selected public rights-of-way prohibited.

A. It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit, peddle, or to distribute handbills at any time in the public rights-of-way, with or without a license, within one thousand (1,000) feet of the following intersections.

1. Cogdell and College Avenue (TX Hwy 350)
2. 42nd and College Avenue (TX Hwy 350)
3. 37th and College Avenue (TX Hwy 350)
4. 30th and College Avenue (TX Hwy 350)
5. 27th and College Avenue (TX Hwy 350)
6. 26th and College Avenue (TX Hwy 350)
7. 25th and College Avenue (TX Hwy 350)
8. 13th and College Avenue (TX Hwy 350)
9. 25th (US Hwy 180) and Avenue R
10. 25th (US Hwy 180) and Avenue E

B. The restrictions in Section Eighteen (A) do not apply to a person who has received authorization pursuant to §552.0071 of Chapter 552 of the Texas Transportation Code.

SECTION II

Repealer. All ordinances, or parts thereof, that are in conflict or inconsistent with any provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall be and remain controlling as to the matters regulated herein.

SECTION III

Severability. The provisions of this ordinance are declared to be severable. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of the ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining sections, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this ordinance, but they shall remain in full force and effect; it being the legislative intent that this ordinance shall remain in effect notwithstanding the validity of any part.

SECTION IV

Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council and publication as may be required by governing law.

SECTION V

Open Meetings. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance is passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act, Texas Government Code, Chapter 551.

DIRECTING ONCOR ELECTRIC DELIVERY COMPANY, LLC TO FILE CERTAIN INFORMATION WITH THE CITY OF SNYDER; SETTING A PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE FOR THE GATHERING AND REVIEW OF NECESSARY INFORMATION IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; SETTING DATES FOR THE FILING OF THE CITY'S ANALYSIS OF THE COMPANY'S FILING AND THE COMPANY'S REBUTTAL TO SUCH ANALYSIS; RATIFYING THE HIRING OF LEGAL COUNSEL AND CONSULTANTS; RESERVING THE RIGHT TO REQUIRE THE REIMBURSEMENT OF THE CITY OF SNYDER'S RATE CASE EXPENSES; SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE PURPOSES OF DETERMINING IF THE EXISTING RATES OF ONCOR ELECTRIC DELIVERY COMPANY ARE UNREASONABLE OR IN ANY WAY IN VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF LAW AND THE DETERMINATION BY THE CITY OF SNYDER OF JUST AND REASONABLE RATES TO BE CHARGED BY ONCOR ELECTRIC DELIVERY COMPANY, LLC.; NOTING COMPLIANCE WITH OPEN MEETINGS LAW; PROVIDING NOTICE OF PASSAGE.

WHEREAS, the City of Snyder is a regulatory authority under the Public Utility Regulatory Act ("PURA") and has original jurisdiction over the rates of Oncor Electric Delivery Company, LLC ("Oncor") to determine if such rates are just and reasonable; and

WHEREAS, Sections 33.021, 36.003 and 36.151 of PURA empower a regulatory authority, on its own motion or on a complaint by any affected person, to determine whether the existing rates of any public utility for any service are unreasonable or in any way in violation of any provision of law, and upon such determination, to determine the just and reasonable rates; and

WHEREAS, the City of Snyder has reason to believe that Oncor is over-earning and its rates are excessive; and

WHEREAS, the City of Snyder is a member of the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor; and

WHEREAS, the Executive Committee of the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor has recommended that cities pass a resolution that requires Oncor to show cause why its transmission and distribution rates should not be reduced; and

WHEREAS, the City of Snyder, and the City Council of the City of Snyder desires, on its own motion, to exercise its authority under Sections 33.021, 36.003 and 36.151 of PURA; and

WHEREAS, a procedural schedule should be established for the filing of certain information by Oncor, procedures to be followed to obtain and review information from Oncor, the filing of an analysis of such information by the City, the filing of rebuttal information from Oncor, and a public hearing at which time the City shall make a determination whether the existing rates of Oncor are unreasonable or are in any way in violation of any provision of law, and if such rates should be revised, and just and reasonable rates determined for Oncor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SNYDER, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. This resolution constitutes notice of the City's intent to proceed with an inquiry into the transmission and distribution rates charged by Oncor. On or before September 1, 2016, Oncor shall file with the City of Snyder information that demonstrates good cause for showing that Oncor's transmission and distribution rates should not be reduced. Specifically, Oncor shall file with the City of Snyder information for the test year beginning January 1, 2015 and ending December 31, 2015, regarding Oncor's cost of service elements, including, but not limited to, the elements detailed by the Public Utility Commission as necessary for the filing of a Statement

of Intent to Change Rates. The test year may be updated for more current data and shall be adjusted for known and measureable changes.

SECTION 2. City's designated representatives shall have the right to obtain additional information from Oncor through the filing of requests for information, which shall be responded to within fifteen (15) days from the receipt of such request for information.

SECTION 3. City's designated representatives shall file their analysis of Oncor's filing and information on or before October 13, 2016.

SECTION 4. Oncor shall file any rebuttal to the analysis of City's representatives on or before November 10, 2016. With its rebuttal, Oncor may present whatever additional information it desires to defend its current rates.

SECTION 5. A public hearing shall be conducted by the City Council for the City of Snyder during a regular council meeting scheduled between November 15 and December 15. At such hearing a representative of Oncor and a representative of the City of Snyder's consultants will each be allowed to address the City Council and summarize previously filed reports for no more than 15 minutes. Based upon such hearing, a determination of the reasonableness of the existing rates of Oncor shall be made by the City Council and, if necessary, just and reasonable rates shall be determined to be thereafter observed and enforced for all services of Oncor within the City of Snyder, Texas.

SECTION 6. The City Council may, from time to time, amend this procedural schedule and enter additional orders as may be necessary in the public interest and to enforce the provisions hereof.

SECTION 7. Subject to the right to terminate employment at any time, the City of Snyder hereby ratifies the Steering Committee's selection of Geoffrey Gay with the law firm of Lloyd, Gosselink, Rochelle & Townsend as legal counsel to assist the City of Snyder in its ratemaking and to prosecute any appeals to the Texas Public Utility Commission or court. The Executive Committee of the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor shall retain appropriate consultants to prepare a report and make rate recommendations.

SECTION 8. Fees and expenses of attorneys and consultants assisting the City in the Steering Committee's review of the reasonableness of Oncor's rates will be processed through the Steering Committee but the City reserves the right to seek reimbursement from Oncor pursuant to the PURA Section 33.023.

SECTION 9. That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this resolution was passed was open to the public as required by law, and that public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given all as required by Section 551.041, Texas Government Code.

SECTION 10. That a copy of this Resolution shall be sent to E. Mr. Holt has served on the Board of Directors of CRMWD since June 12, 2002. Before his current term, he served on the Board for 11 years. He is currently serving as the President of the Board of Directors, Chair of the Executive Committee and member of the Operations and Electric Power Committees.

Mr. Knowles has served on the Board of Directors of CRMWD since January 14, 2015 and is a member of the Administration and Audit Committee.

As set forth in the District's enabling legislation, the terms and qualifications of the Directors are:

"...in May of each year the governing body of each of the cities in Section 2 of this Act shall appoint two (2) directors for the two-year term beginning on June 1 of that year. Each director shall serve for his term of office as herein provided, and thereafter until his successor shall be appointed and qualified. No person shall be appointed a director unless he resides in and owns taxable property in the city from which he is appointed.
