Discussion regarding traffic control at the Snyder Christian School. – The Snyder Police Department conducted a week-long traffic survey on speeding vehicles on Avenue R that runs adjacent to the school's location. Between February 22nd and March 3rd 484 vehicles traveled on Avenue R between 26th and 28th street. Of those vehicles, none were recorded speeding. The Snyder Police Department will continue to study the traffic in the area including 27th street and College Avenue.


